Year 9 (KS4)	ART AND PHOTOGRAPHY Students will reflect on and implement prior learning. The main focus being further development the of all formal elements. They will investigate and use different techniques to explore each one. Students will use relevant subject matter to inform their studies and research. They will research a range of commercial/graphic art to support their personal interpretation of the project title. Students will create a mixed media piece of work that could be used to advertise the New Forest School end of year leavers performance. They will then swap to Photography for the second term.	ART AND PHOTOGRAPHY Students will spend this ½ term learning about the basic compositional rules of photography. They will develop their understanding of how to use a digital cameras or iPads. Documenting their experiments and outcomes. Students will take and save images and edit them using a digital editing program. Students will refer to the Cubism movement and joiner photography, researching relevant artists and designers to develop a final piece in response to the project brief. The final piece of work will incorporate a variety of elements that were investigated and developed during the previous ½ term.	SELF-DIRECTED Students will reflect on and use <i>all</i> learned skills and techniques. Students will complete a hybrid project of Art and Photography to embed and secure the skills they have built throughout the year. They will look at typography and develop their own graphic fonts that they will build into their work from the previous terms.
Year 10 (KS4)	COMPONENT ONE DEVELOPMENT (practice) Students will be adhering to the AQA Assessment objectives. Students will be encouraged to reflect on prior learning, including presentation skills and art techniques. They will further develop and refine their abilities to obtain an achievable grade these in line with the GCSE Art criteria. Using a range of 2D materials to create drawings, paintings, collages and prints that reflect both the natural and man- made aspects of the coast line. Students will create a series of experiments based on the work of other artists and their own gathered resources.	COMPONENT ONE DEVELOPMENT (practice) Students will further develop their investigations and ideas by creating a final piece that reflects their explorations of the local coastal areas. Their work will be connected to that of other artists they have researched and their earlier experiments and collected resources. Their final piece will utilise as many of the skills they have learned and developed. A mixed media piece would clearly demonstrate their abilities of work that represents an aspect of manmade or natural coastline environments.	COMPONENT ONE DEVELOPMENT Students will be starting their second project that will lead in to Year 11. Using sources gathered throughout previous terms, students will spend this term experimenting with a mixed media approach to 3D modelling. Students will create both Marquette's (preliminary experiments) and sculptural pieces. These will inform their ideas in year 11.
